

# Ordinance No. 1984-27 Water Cross Connections

An Ordinance regulating water cross connections.

THE VILLAGE OF SOUTH RANGE ORDAINS:

Section 1. That the Village of South Range adopts by reference the Water Supply Cross Connection rules of the Michigan Department of Public Health, being R325.11401 to R325.11407 of the Michigan Administrative Code.

Section 2. That it shall be the duty of the Village of South Range to cause inspections to be made of all properties served by the public water supply where cross connections with the public water supply is deemed possible. The frequency of inspections and reinspection based on potential health hazards involved shall be as established by the Village of South Range and as approved by the Michigan Department of Public Health.

Section 3. That the representative of the Village of South Range shall have the right to enter at any reasonable time any property served by a connection to the public water supply system of the Village of South Range for the purpose of inspecting the piping system or systems thereof for cross connections. On request the owner, lessees or occupants of any property so served shall furnish to the inspection agency any pertinent information regarding the piping system or systems on such property. The refusal of such information or refusal of access, when requested, shall be deemed evidence of the presence of cross connections.

Section 4. That the Village of South Range is hereby authorized and directed to discontinue water service after reasonable notice to any property wherein any connection in violation of this ordinance exists, and to take such other precautionary measures deemed necessary to eliminate any danger of contamination of the public water supply system. Water service to such property shall not be restored until the cross connection(s) has been eliminated in compliance with the provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 5. That the potable water supply made available on the properties served by the public water supply shall be protected from possible contamination as specified by this ordinance and by the state and Village plumbing code. Any water outlet which could be used for potable or domestic purposes and which is not supplied by the potable system must be labeled in a conspicuous manner as:

Water Unsafe  
for Drinking

Section 6. That this Ordinance does not supersede the State Plumbing Code and Village Plumbing Ordinance but is supplementary to them.

Section 7. That any person or customer found guilty of violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance, or any written order of the Village of South Range, in pursuance thereof, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$500.00 and/or ninety (90) days in jail for each violation. Each day upon which a violation of the provisions of this Act shall occur shall be deemed a separate and additional violation for the purpose of this Ordinance.

This Ordinance shall take effect on August 22, 1984.
